

What's the story?

On June 1st, a boat named **Madleen** sailed from Italy to bring help to Gaza, where people don't have enough food or medicine.
On board? 12 peace activists, including famous climate warrior

Greta Thunberg!

They weren't carrying much — just rice and baby formula — but their message was powerful:

"The world needs to look at what's happening in Gaza."

But the boat never made it.

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What stopped them?

The Israeli Navy stopped the boat and took it to a port called **Ashdod**.

Why?

Israel says it could be unsafe — Gaza is controlled by a group called Hamas, which has attacked Israel in the past.

They want to stop weapons from getting in by sea.

Because of this **blockade** — a rule that controls what can go in and out of Gaza. Israel says it's needed for safety.

But the United Nations and others say it's too strict, and it's making life horrible for ordinary people.

People are stuck between starving slowly or risking danger to find food.



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#### What happened on the boat?

Before losing contact, the activists shared a video saying:

"If you see this, we've been intercepted and kidnapped."

The activist group behind the trip — Freedom Flotilla

Coalition — says the mission was peaceful and important.

They believe people need to see what's going on in Gaza.

Oceans are in serious threat from pollution and climate change. To find solutions, world leaders and scientists met in Nice, France on 09 Jun 2025 at the UN Ocean Conference.

They found









Now let's get back to our cat story, shall we?



Australian Open 2012 Finals Longest Match Ever: 5hr 53 minutes


